Textiles, metals, paper, paints, marker, pencil, charcoal, wood, ceramics, glass, wax and sand are all examples of materials that can be combined to create mixed media or collage works for this exhibit. Your piece may leave the viewer to imagine where the pathway might lead or it may depict the ending location. It may be artwork of a path, a trail, a sidewalk, a tunnel, a track or your own imagined pathway – anything that leads your viewer to another place. <u>November 22 – December 29</u> <u>Gingerbread Dreams</u> <u>Open call for entries</u> Artists in all mediums are invited to submit works for this exciting exhibit that highlights the wonder of the season with the theme of Gingerbread Dreams. From holiday baking memories to vision of sugarplums, your artwork should embrace the joy and yumminess of the holiday season. Artwork using or created with AI must be noted on the entry form.

Not sure if this exhibit is for you? Consider designing <u>a painted gingerbread house</u> on our blank wooden house-shaped panel. These panels will be available for pick-up on November 1 for FREE and should be returned by November 19 for display in the gallery through December 29.

Do you prefer baking with REAL Gingerbread? Create your own <u>Gingerbread building</u> for the companion exhibit "Loudoun in Gingerbread". Pick a Loudoun landmark and create it in gingerbread for display in our gallery during the Gingerbread Dreams exhibit.

It can be something everyone would recognize – such as a library or historic structure or a steeplechase race --or it can be something that you think is uniquely Loudoun. Just make sure that the main building material is gingerbread and keep in mind that it will be on display for 5 weeks.

January 10 - February 9Yin and YangOpen call for entriesArtists are invited to submit artwork that shows the complement of opposites. Yin and Yang are two complementary principles of Chinese philosophy. Yin is negative, dark, and feminine, Yang positive, bright, and masculine. Their interaction is thought to maintain the harmony of the universe and to influence everything within it. *Your artwork should show a connection of opposites – cold and warm, smooth and rough, clear and opaque, for* examples. Though the symbol of yin and yang is often in black and white, your submission may be in color.
